

Sue Clark-Wittenberg is an electroshock survivor. Sue and her husband Steven founded the Wittenberg Centre to End Electroshock in 2007 in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. The blog for the center is at: <http://wittenbergces.blogspot.com>

Sue was forced to have ECT against her will at the age of 17 years old in 1973 at the Brockville Psychiatric Hospital, Ontario, Canada.

On her 5th electroshock, Sue's heart stopped and she had to be revived. Sue suffers from permanent memory loss as a result of having had electroshock. Sue has a difficult time to learn new things. She went to Carleton University in 1995 and had to quit school after one semester because she could not remember what she was learning. Sue's daily life is chaotic as she cannot remember any of her appointments and where she puts things in her house.

Electroshock has greatly impeded Sue' life.

She spent 18 years in and out psychiatric hospitals in Ontario from 1972 to 1990. Sue is free of psychiatry since 1990. She has not been admitted to a psychiatric ward nor has she been on psychiatric medication since that time.
